iVoteAmerica believes that the precepts that once governed the nation are now being eroded at an alarming rate. This erosion has placed the nation in grave danger of losing its moral, legal, national and economic underpinnings.

We have examined carefully the tenets which, since the founding of America, created the initial foundation for the rule of law, the practice of government and the freedom of our people.

Therefore, we ask you to carefully review this Manifesto and to subscribe to its tenets, not in part but in full, for its principles are inseparable with each being inexorably tied to the others.

Principles Regarding the Rights of Persons, Governments and the Governed

Tenet One:	There is a Creator.
Tenet Two:	Unalienable rights are bestowed by the Creator.
Tenet Three:	All individual persons possess the Creator's unalienable rights.
Tenet Four:	Unalienable rights can never be diminished by the law of man.
Tenet Five:	The first unalienable right is the right to life.
Tenet Six:	The second unalienable right is the right to liberty (freedom).
Tenet Seven:	The third unalienable right is the right to pursue happiness.
Tenet Eight:	Men institute governments to secure tenets five, six and seven.
Tenet Nine:	Government has no power except that granted by the people.
Tenant Ten:	People may dissolve a government destructive of God-given rights.

Principles Regarding the Limitations of the Government

Tenet One:	Governments are not the source of the rights of free men.
Tenet Two:	Free men grant government temporary authority to govern.
Tenet Three:	Centralized government removed from men results in tyranny.
Tenet Four:	Government may not exist in any form, without the consent of men.
Tenet Five:	No government may redefine the unalienable right to life.
Tenet Six:	Government must protect the nation's security and its borders.
Tenet Seven:	Taxation must never diminish the individual pursuits of men.
Tenet Eight:	Government is controlled by diminishing its size and duration.
Tenet Nine:	The rights granted the governed supersede all rights of government.
Tenant Ten:	Government has no unalienable rights.

Principles Regarding the Power and Rights of each Person

Tenet One:	All men possess an individual and undiminished right to speak.
Tenet Two:	Each person may exercise religious choice without consent.
Tenet Three:	Religious expression in the public arena should be undiminished.
Tenet Four:	Men may always and forever keep and bear arms.
Tenet Five:	Free assembly shall never be restricted by law or tyranny.
Tenet Six:	Individual power and rights shall be enforced by the rule of law.
Tenet Seven:	Each person's rights are greater than the collective rights of men.
Tenet Eight:	Unlawful search and seizure shall never be permitted.
Tenet Nine:	The opportunity of advancement and gain shall not be infringed.
Tenant Ten:	Unalienable rights shall include those unable to speak in defense.

Principles Regarding the Powers and Rights of the Legislature

Tenet One:	No legislator may be in office without the vote of the governed.
Tenet Two:	Legislators shall be legally prohibited from an office-in-perpetuity.
Tenet Three:	Law shall not be enacted by the Executive and Judicial branches.
Tenet Four:	Congress' power is temporarily granted to it by governed.
Tenet Five:	Laws enacted by the Legislature are rescindable by the governed.
Tenet Six:	Pending law shall be adequately posted for review by the governed.
Tenet Seven:	No law shall force the governed to engage in mandatory purchases.
Tenet Eight:	Distribution of wealth may not be mandated by legislative actions.
Tenet Nine:	Congress may not endorse any form of amnesty for illegal aliens.
Tenant Ten:	The Legislature may not enact law or budgets creating deficits.

Principles Regarding the Power and Rights of the Judiciary

Tenet One:	Courts are obligated to provide redress to legal citizens only.
Tenet Two:	Courts may render judgments based upon foreign law or precedent.
Tenet Three:	The judiciary may only interpret existing law devoid of hypothetical.
Tenet Four:	Our law shall find its basis solely in the Judeo Christian heritage.
Tenet Five:	Capital punishment is a valid judicial remedy.
Tenet Six:	Illegal aliens shall not be provided the same protections of citizens.
Tenet Seven:	The Supreme Court shall remain the final judicial point of recourse.
Tenet Eight:	Punishment of those who inflict harm to children must be extreme.
Tenet Nine:	An unconstitutional Judiciary must be removed by the governed.
Tenant Ten:	Social trending and statistical law shall not be precedent in law.

Principles Regarding the Power and Rights of the Executive

Tenet One:	The President is the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the nation.
Tenet Two:	The Executive has no power to enact an order obligatory as law.
Tenet Three:	Irrefutable proof of US birth must be offered by the President.
Tenet Four:	Irrefutable proof of US birth must be offered by the Vice President.
Tenet Five:	The Executive may not appoint during Congressional recess.
Tenet Six:	The Executive may not stipulate expenditures by Executive Order.
Tenet Seven:	The Executive shall have the power to veto any portion of a bill.
Tenet Eight:	Congressional approval shall be required for all Executive treaties.
Tenet Nine:	The Executive shall not interfere with State's rights or enacted laws.
Tenant Ten:	The Executive shall not request foreign officers to address Congress.

Principles Regarding the Social Obligations of the Governed

Tenet One:	We defend the unalienable rights of our weakest members.
Tenet Two:	We are obligated to alter, abolish and replace corrupt government.
Tenet Three:	We accept the mandate to ensure the liberty of future generations.
Tenet Four:	We are ever vigilant in the protection of our constitution.
Tenet Five:	We anticipate at all times the tendency of government to deceive.
Tenet Six:	We forbid the elected to occupy positions of perpetual power.
Tenet Seven:	We desire that all citizens be or become so without violation of law.
Tenet Eight:	We insist that our national sovereignty never be compromised.
Tenet Nine:	We transmit the truths about America to succeeding generation.
Tenant Ten:	We hold the truth of our endowment by a Creator to be self evident.
